Word Salad

- cut up words on different topics
- five or six per student
- mix of nouns, adjectives and verbs
- make as many sentences as possible

Collaborative-writing activity

- Groups of six

- Pairs look at their picture and write down words:

 - 2-3 verbs
 - Character names
- Groups of 6 order pictures
- Students write sentences together
- Review linking devices
- Students write final stories and present to group/class













Reading & Writing: A few tips

- Write in short bursts, but often.
- Encourage collaborative writing.
- Relate writing tasks to students' interests.
- Write for a specific purpose/audience.
- Provide lots of visual prompts.






